terms to standardize terminologyall schools statewidend to eliminate confusion reated from misuse of terms that sound similar:

- Evacuate and evacuation mean to move students for their protection from a school building to a predetermined location in response to an emergency.
- Shelterand shelter place mean keeping students in school **bugks** and providing them with shelter when it is deemed safer for students to remain inside rather than to return home or be evacuated.
- Lockdownmeans to immediately clear the hallways, lock and/or barricade doors, hide from view, and remain silent whileardying a plan of evacuation as a last resort. Lockdown will only end upon physical release from the room or secured area by law enforcement. Lockdown is initiated during incidents that pose an immediate threat of violence in or around the school.
- Hold and Hold in place mean the restriction of movement of studentsstatid within the building while dealing with short term emergencies.
